Monroe 2 - Orleans BOCES 3599 Big Ridge Road Spencerport, New York 14559 hereinafter referred to as the "Tenant"

WITNESSETH:

The Landlord owns a building at 3555 Buffalo Road, Suite I, Rochester, New York 14624 and the Tenant is desirous of leasing certain space for use by the Tenant, for the purposes of general office and office related, education related and reemployment purposes;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the rents, covenants and agreements hereinafter set forth, the Landlord does lease to the Tenant, and the Tenant does lease from the Landlord lands with the appurtenances and privileges herein described upon the following terms and conditions:

- 1. The premises hereby leased is a facility located at 3555 Buffalo Road, Suite I, Rochester, New York 14624 consisting of a total of Eleven Thousand Eight Hundred Twenty (11,820) square feet of office and classroom space.
 - 2. The Tenant shall pay as and for rent of said premises the following:

Rent payments are due monthly and shall commence as of the 1st day of July, 2019. Accrued rent for the months of July through November of 2019 shall be payable upon the execution of this lease. Thereafter, rent shall be payable on the 1st day of each month in the sum of FIVE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED TEN DOLLARS (\$5,910.00) for a total annual rent payment of SEVENTY THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED TWENTY DOLLARS (\$70,920.00). The amount due and payable upon the signing of this lease shall be TWENTY NINE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS (\$29,550.00).

- 3. The term of this lease shall be for ten (10) years commencing as of the 1st day of July, 2019. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the foregoing, it is also agreed that Tenant may terminate this Lease upon one hundred twenty (120) days written notice to Landlord in the event that: (i) in enrollment of the Tenant's school on the Premises substantially increases or decreases; (ii) Tenant experiences a substantial change in its needs with respect to the Premises; Tenant or the community which it serves experiences any changes that substantially affect their needs; (iii) non-funding by governmental agencies or similar occurrences cause continuation of the BOCES program to be impacted. Tenant hereby agrees to provide written notice of the foregoing to Landlord as soon as is reasonably practical.
- 4. Landlord and Tenant recognize that certain capital expenditures will be required, including the replacement of two (2) furnaces and the replacement of roof shingles with a new thirty (30) year guaranty architectural shingle roofing and the resealing and striping of the parking lot. Landlord shall be responsible for arranging for this work to be completed and Tenant shall reimburse Landlord for thirty (30%) percent of the costs of these improvements. All such work shall be completed in a timely manner. Landlord agrees to have the replacement of two (2) furnaces and the resealing and striping of the parking lot completed by

September 1, 2020 with the replacement of roof shingles with a new thirty (30) year guaranty architectural shingle roofing completed on an as needed basis but in no event later than by September 1, 2025.

- 5. The Tenant shall be responsible to pay for metered utilities including water, gas, fuel oil and electricity.
- 6. Tenant must give Landlord prompt notice of fire, accident, damage or dangerous or defective condition. A dangerous or defective condition includes damage or injury resulting from snow and ice buildup, and/or melting on sidewalks, parking lots and off roofs. If the premises cannot be used because of fire or other casualty. Tenant is not required to pay rent for the time the premises are unusable on the unusable portion of the space. Landlord is responsible to incur costs not covered by Tenant's insurance to repair any damaged portion of the building interior or exterior unless such damage is the result of the Tenant's gross negligence.
- 7. The Tenant agrees to provide general liability insurance, \$3,000,000 for the general aggregate and \$1,000,000 for each occurrence, for any damage or injury resulting from the negligence of the Tenant, its employees or student body, and shall name Landlord as additional insured. The Landlord shall maintain insurance covering its own liability, \$3,000,000 for the general aggregate and \$1,000,000 for each occurrence, for any damage or injury, regarding the Lease and shall provide all other types of insurance including but not limited to fire insurance. Both parties will provide a certificate of insurance upon request of the other party.
- 8. The Tenant shall not assign this agreement or underlet or underlease the premises, or any part thereof, or make any alterations on the premises, without the Landlord's consent in writing; or occupy, or permit or suffer the same to be occupied for any business other than that specified above.
- 9. The Tenant shall take good care of the premises including the grounds and buildings, (including snow and ice removal from the parking lots and all exterior areas of the buildings not limited to roofs and sidewalks) and shall make any and all cosmetic interior repairs to the building resulting from its occupancy and/or use, normal wear and tear excepted. Such maintenance shall also include maintenance of lawn and flower beds. The Landlord shall be responsible for making all structural and other repairs, including but not limited to exterior walls, windows, roof (except as set forth in Paragraph 4 hereof), foundation, breakdown of equipment, HVAC, electrical, and the plumbing system, provided not caused by Tenant gross negligence. The Landlord shall be responsible for making any and all interior repairs to damage as a result of structural damage or during Landlord repairs. Tenant shall be responsible to contract with and pay for a routine maintenance contract for the HVAC with an qualified third party provider.
- 10. Any building changes which are contemplated by the Tenant must first be approved by the Landlord.
 - 11. The Landlord agrees to:
 - (a) Provide Tenant with outside keys and interior keys. In the event of loss of keys, the Tenant agrees to inform the Landlord immediately. The Tenant also agrees to pay the cost of replacement of individual keys. If in the judgement of the Landlord and competent police authority the building ought to be re-keyed due to the Tenant's negligence or inadvertence, the Tenant agrees to pay the cost of re-keying the affected areas of the facility. (The cost of re-keying is not to exceed \$500.00.)
 - (b) Provide adequate parking facilities for BOCES personnel adjacent to the building where space is being leased.
 - (c) Pay all county, state, local property and other taxes.
 - 12. The Tenant shall be free to use the facilities at reasonable times that are mutually agreeable.
- 13. If after default in payment of rent or violation of any other provisions of this lease, the Tenant moves out or is dispossessed and fails to remove any trade fixtures or other personal property prior to such default, removal, expiration of lease, or prior to the issuance of the final order of execution of the warrant, then and in that event, the fixtures and property shall be deemed abandoned by the said Tenant and shall become the

property of the Landlord. However, the Tenant reserves the right to remove any fixtures and/or materials at the termination of the within lease or any extensions thereof except for any fiber optic cable.

- 14. The Landlord further covenants that the said Tenant on paying the said yearly rent, and performing the covenants aforesaid shall and may peacefully and quietly have, hold and enjoy the said premises for the term aforesaid, provided however, that this covenant shall be not conditioned upon the retention of title to the premises by the Landlord.
- 15. In the event any provision of this agreement shall be held invalid and unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall be valid and binding upon the parties. One or more waivers by either party of any provision, term, condition or covenant shall not be construed by the other party as a waiver of subsequent breach of same by the other party.
- 16. Any changes or amendments to this lease must be in writing and executed by the parties hereto.
- 17. Notwithstanding the limits of any policy of insurance provided by the Landlord pursuant to this Agreement, the Landlord agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Tenant and at the request of the Tenant, defend the Tenant against any and all claims, judgments, costs, awards, liability, loss, damage, suit or expense of any kind which the Tenant may incur, suffer or be required to pay by reason of or in consequence, directly or indirectly, of the fault, failure, omission or negligence of the Landlord, its agents, officers, members, directors or employees, including any misrepresentations contained in the Agreement or the breach of any warranty made herein or the failure of the Landlord to carry out its duties under this Agreement or otherwise arising out of or in connection with, directly or indirectly, this Agreement. Notwithstanding the limits of any policy of insurance provided by the Tenant pursuant to this Agreement, the Tenant agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Landlord and at the request of the Landlord, defend the Landlord against any and all claims, judgments, costs, awards, liability, loss, damage, suit or expense of any kind which the Landlord may incur, suffer or be required to pay by reason of or in consequence, directly or indirectly, of the fault, failure, omission or gross negligence of the Tenant, its agents, officers, members, directors or employees, including any misrepresentations contained in the Agreement or the breach of any warranty made herein or the failure of the Tenant to carry out its duties under this Agreement or otherwise arising out of or in connection with, directly or indirectly, this Agreement.
