THERAPEUTIC CRISIS INTERVENTION FOR SCHOOLS OVERVIEW - FULL TRAINING

This training is offered as a four-day format which allows for certification in verbal and physical interventions. This entire training will be conducted in-person. Participants must attend all four days for certification. Materials: You will be receiving a TCIS Student Workbook. You are responsible for reading this entire workbook. Please read Modules 1-3 (through page W43) prior to the first day of training, and be sure to bring your workbook to the training

Physical Component: You will be asked to participate in a required physical component to this training in order to be certified in TCIS. If you cannot participate in the physical component, you are still required to stay for the entire duration of the training. Attire: Wear comfortable clothes, closed-toed shoes, mask and bring any other PPE you would typically use for a physical restraint. (i.e., face shield). Lunch is on your own.

APPR Initial Training for Lead Evaluators of Teachers

This training is for new administrators who have not been previously trained. The State Education Department (SED) requires all evaluators of teachers to be certified through an appropriate training process. Lead teacher evaluators are those who conduct summative annual professional performance reviews (APPR). The district must certify that these lead evaluators have been trained in the minimum requirements as outlined in the new APPR regulations. The training that we provide will meet this requirement in the manner prescribed by the SED. You must complete all four days for certification.

Developing Decoding Skills in Young Learners

Dr. Lindsey will discuss what research tell us about reading, focusing on the importance and power of decoding. Then, she will help you understand how to empower yourself and your students with the highest leverage instructional practices to make sure children are able to efficiently and effectively become

proficient word readers and spellers. Dr. Lindsey will offer you something to change or consider to make your foundational reading instruction more research-aligned without sacrificing joy, cultural responsiveness or comprehension.

Workshop 1: The P Words: Phonics and Phonemic Awareness

Understand the critical aspects of whole group phonics and phonemic awareness instruction. No matter what curriculum you use, you'll be able to add new routines or swap your language to create more powerful phonics lessons.

Workshop 2: Beyond Phonics: Having "It All" in Small Groups

Learn about how to rethink small group reading (centers, stations, guided reading, etc.) to better match research and to support multiple purposes. Dr. Lindsey will offer you two ways to think about the utility of this time of day and a framework for evaluating the purposefulness of small group time. Then, Dr. Lindsey will discuss how content-rich decodable texts can support children's decoding and beyond. You'll leave with resources to ensure your next small group is even more purposeful for developing decoding skills.

Speaker Bio:Julia B. Lindsey, Ph.D., is a foundational literacy expert, consultant and proud former elementary school teacher. Her work aims to help educators implement research findings in reading instruction.

She is the author of the newly released book, "Reading Above the Fray: Research-based Routines for Developing Decoding Skills." Julia is also the creator of a framework for researchtested, content-rich decodable texts used by districts, curriculum developers and tens of thousands of teachers across the globe.

MONIOUE BURR FOUNDATION CERTIFIED FACILITATOR TRAINING (ToT)

The Train the Trainer (ToT) workshop will prepare and educate school staff designated to implement the Monique Burr Foundation (MBF) Child Safety Matters (grades K-5) and/or Teen Safety Matters (grades 6-9; 9-12) curriculum during the 2023-24 school year. During the ToT training, facilitators will also receive Less Is More training. Created by the New York State Children's Alliance, Inc., the Less is More training highlights the integral role a Mandated Reporter has in a child abuse investigation process. Our goal is to help facilitators feel confident about communicating with students who have experienced trauma, what to do when they suspect child abuse and reassure them of the importance of their role when it comes to protecting children. The objectives include knowing what is needed to make a referral, how to gather necessary information without questioning the child, the importance of the role of a Mandated Reporter, what a CAC is and how it works, and why some cases do not move forward. To ensure maximum learning potential, each full day ToT workshop will consist of a maximum of 25 participants. Multiple sessions will be offered throughout the school year. Districts will be charged an additional subscription fee for MBF materials.

CURRICULUM REVIEW/AUDITS

The Curriculum Review/Audits service is intended to assist districts in the evaluation of their curriculum and/or programs. Curriculum Reviews/Audits consist of classroom visitations, interviews with teachers/administrators, teacher and administrator surveys, a review of available resources, and a comprehensive report of findings and recommendations. Each curriculum review/audit will be developed in conjunction with the district and individualized to meet their needs.

Curriculum Reviews/Audits are conducted by a Monroe 2-Orleans BOCES team consisting of the Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum, Instruction and Professional Development and instructional specialists.

CURRICULUM WRITING

This service is intended to assist districts in writing curriculum K-12 that aligns with NYS Learning Standards and core curricula. Best practice in curriculum design is utilized at BOCES 2.

Collaborative curriculum development is available, as is BOCES 2 development and writing of documents for districts. The goal of these writings is to develop flexible, responsive documents that ensure coverage of key content and skills while providing maximum opportunities to incorporate resources and teaching strategies that meet the needs of diverse learners.

Services

Special Education Instructional Service

The Special Education Instructional service is designed to improve understanding of the academic and behavioral needs of students with disabilities, along with improved instruction in the classroom resulting in an increase in student achievement. Students with disabilities have the right to high-quality instruction to reach the same standards as all students. Our goal is for students to leave school prepared to successfully transition to post-school learning, living and working. All special education services provide access in order for students to make meaningful connections to their education and future.

Our Special Education Specialist can support teachers and administrators of students with disabilities through a variety of services including, but not limited to: technical assistance, job-embedded support, and district or school systems work. The Special Education Specialist is able to support any work related to the State Performance Plan (SPP) Indicators in accordance with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA).

Instructional Coaching – Math and Literacy

Well-versed in research, theory and best practices of instruction, our experienced personnel will partner with teachers and building leaders to set goals for improved student achievement. Through this partnership approach, coaches will work with teachers in a job-embedded format as they move through the stages of a coaching cycle, including gathering of data to inform goals, demonstrating new instructional practices, coteaching of lessons, engaging in reflective conversations, providing feedback and collecting evidence of student achievement.

In addition to 1:1 opportunities, our coaches can model lessons for groups of teachers, conduct group meetings on an ongoing basis, assist with the development and implementation of standards-aligned lessons, and support the deep analysis of student work. With their expertise in the Next Generation Standards for English Language Arts and Mathematics, our coaches can assist districts in meeting the increasing demands by working collaboratively with teachers to provide high-quality instruction.

LITERACY AUDIT

Designed to address district-specific questions, this service can provide a "state of the state" look at K-12 literacy programs. The audit process can be completed with a focus on curriculum alignment and vertical articulation, resource implementation or assessment results. BOCES 2 staff will work with district personnel to develop a framework that meets district needs.

Audit services can include, but are not limited to:

- Review of curriculum documents with a focus on NYS grade-level standards.
- Classroom walkthroughs to address resource and strategy implementation.
- Grade-level meetings to investigate teacher perception of program strengths/needs.
- Principal interviews to gather leadership data on the state of the literacy program.
- An analysis of professional development opportunities and their impact on classroom instruction.

Districts are encouraged to meet with BOCES 2 staff to create an individualized audit process, utilizing only those elements that serve to answer their unique literacy needs. A thorough report with program analysis and needs assessment will be included for participating districts.

BOCES 4 Science is committed to ensuring that science training is widely available. Please be aware that our schedule of course offerings changes frequently, and the most up-to-date listing of professional learning workshops is always on our website at http://www.boces4science.org.

ELS AND ILS INVESTIGATIONS Professional Learning

The Investigations are hands-on laboratory experiences that prepare students for the written Elementary- and Intermediate-Level Science Tests that will be administered in Grades 5 and 8, respectively, in Spring 2024. At least 15% of the questions on the written tests will measure content related to the performance expectations measured by the Investigations. Other questions will assess concepts related to the activities undertaken by students in the Investigations.

The Investigations are designed to be embedded in instruction and can be offered any time prior to the written tests. Teachers may administer them when the particular learning standards assessed within each Investigation are addressed by their instruction or at another time of their choosing. The Investigations provide hands-on opportunities to demonstrate attainment of science knowledge and skills, as they are locally-administered performance-based tasks.

To assist educators in their understanding of and preparation for working with the Investigations, BOCES 4 Science is offering kits that correspond to each of the ELS and ILS Investigations, along with complementary professional learning.
