FUNDAMENTALS OF STRUCTURED TEACCHING (VIRTUAL)

The Fundamentals of Structured TEACCHing workshop is setup as nine, two-hour virtual sessions that will provide participants with an overview of the learning styles of individuals with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) and Structured TEACCHing. Structured TEACCHing is based on the understanding of the symptoms and learning styles of individuals with autism and the use of visual supports to provide meaning, promote independence and capitalize on the individual's strengths. Participants will also learn antecedent-based behavior management strategies using Structured TEACCHing principles. The format of this workshop will include presentations, videos, interactive discussions based on case studies and small group activities.

Upon completion of this training, the participant will be able to tdentify learning styles of Autism Spectrum Disorder, design the physical organization of learning spaces for students with ASD, develop individualized schedules and work systems, develop meaningful visual structure that promotes independence with educational, leisure and self-care activities, and implement an antecedent-based behavior problem solving approach to engage students in the expected behavior.

MTSS (Multi-Tier System of Supports) 5 day Training, presented by Jim Wright, Educational Trainer & Consultant

Day 1: MTSS for Academics: Supporting Students in the Age of Covid-19. The Covid pandemic has increased the number of academically 'at-risk' students in many districts. This 'recalibration' training reviews best practices in MTSS and demonstrates how to establish MTSS academic intervention. Participants will also have the opportunity to analyze their own academic support services and select next steps to strengthen MTSS in their school or district.

Day 2: Building a Classroom Intervention Toolkit. This training demonstrates effective Tier 1/classroom interventions across a variety of academic areas.

Day 3: Building a Classroom Data-Collection Toolkit. The workshop will demonstrate common, feasible datacollection methods (e.g., curriculum-based measurement, rubrics, work products, checklists, etc.) to track the progress of Tier 1/classroom interventions.

Day 4: Fixing Off-Grade-Level Gaps with Small-Group Interventions. At-risk students with off-grade-level skill gaps need targeted, small-group, high-quality academic interventions to catch up with peers.

Day 5: Creating Individual Support Plans: MTSS Problem-Solving Team. The MTSS Problem-Solving Team ('MTSS Team') is a crucial component of a school's MTSS process, as it develops individualized intervention plans for students with the most intensive academic and behavioral challenges.

Jim Wright, the presenter, is a national trainer and consultant to schools and organizations on Response to Intervention/Multi-Tier System of Supports and topics relating to educational change and at-risk learners. He is also a certified school psychologist and school administrator, with over 17 years' experience working in public schools in central New York State.

CURRICULUM REVIEW/AUDITS

The Curriculum Review/Audits service is intended to assist districts in the evaluation of their curriculum and/or programs. Curriculum Reviews/Audits consist of classroom visitations, interviews with teachers/administrators, teacher and administrator surveys, a review of available resources, and a comprehensive report of findings and recommendations. Each curriculum review/audit will be developed in conjunction with the district and individualized to meet their needs.

Curriculum Reviews/Audits are conducted by a Monroe 2–Orleans BOCES team consisting of the Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum, Instruction and Professional Development and instructional specialists.

CURRICULUM WRITING

This service is intended to assist districts in writing curriculum K-12 that aligns with NYS Learning Standards and core curricula. Best practice in curriculum design is utilized at Monroe 2–Orleans BOCES.

Collaborative curriculum development is available, as is BOCES 2 development and writing of documents for districts. Students with disabilities have the right to high-quality instruction to reach the same standards as all students. Our goal is for students to leave school prepared to successfully transition to post-school learning, living, and working. All special education services provide access in order for students to make meaningful connections to their education and future.

Our Special Education Specialist can support teachers and administrators of students with disabilities through a variety of services, including but not limited to: technical assistance, job-embedded support, and district or school systems work. The Special Education Specialist is able to support any work related to the State Performance Plan (SPP) Indicators in accordance with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA).

Instructional Coaching – Math and Literacy

Well-versed in research, theory, and best practices of instruction, our experienced personnel will partner with teachers and building leaders to set goals for improved student achievement. Through this partnership approach, coaches will work with teachers in a job-embedded format as they move through the stages of a coaching cycle, including gathering of data to inform goals, demonstrating new instructional practices, coteaching of lessons, engaging in reflective conversations, providing feedback, and collecting evidence of student achievement.

In addition to 1:1 opportunities, our coaches can model lessons for groups of teachers, conduct group meetings on an ongoing basis, assist with the development and implementation of standards-aligned lessons, and support the deep analysis of student work.

With their expertise in the Next Generation Standards for English Language Arts and Mathematics, our coaches can assist districts in meeting the increasing demands by working collaboratively with teachers to provide highquality instruction.

LITERACY AUDIT

Designed to address district-specific questions, this service can provide a "state-of-the state" look at K-12 literacy programs. The audit process can be completed with a focus on curriculum alignment and vertical articulation, resource implementation or assessment results. BOCES 2 staff will work with district personnel to develop a framework that meets district needs.

Audit services can include but are not limited to:

- Review of curriculum documents with a focus on NYS grade-level standards.
- Classroom walkthroughs to address resource and strategy implementation.
- Grade-level meetings to investigate teacher perception of program strengths/needs.
- Principal interviews to gather leadership data on the state of the math program.
- An analysis of professional development opportunities and their impact on classroom instruction.

Districts are encouraged to meet with BOCES 2 staff to create an individualized audit process, utilizing only those elements that serve to answer their unique literacy needs. A thorough report with program analysis and needs assessment will be included for participating districts.

Services (continued)

Instructional Coaching Services with the Whole Child in Mind

Whole Child Coaching Services is a proactive support for all content areas K-12 which will address the initiatives within ESSA. Experienced coaches will support teachers with student skill development and purposeful integration of early learning standards, the SEL 5 Core Competencies, and explicit teaching around social emotional skills.

The services will be designed to support teachers and administrators in meeting their students' social and emotional needs; including but not limited to: technical assistance, modeling lessons, best practice resources, job-embedded support, and professional development. Support options include:

- Implementation of the New York State Social Emotional Learning Benchmarks
- Identification and implementation instructional practices aligned with NYSED's P-3 Early Childhood Learning philosophy
- Effective incorporation of play as a strategy (intentional vs exploratory)
- Incorporation of Mindfulness practices
- Character Education
- Complementary support of the work of The Children's Institute and Partners in Restorative Initiatives



VIDEO COACHING

We carry technology around all day to keep our calendars, check our email, and store pictures of our pets. But, can phones and tablets help us become better teachers? They can now.

More than standard observation, video coaching allows teachers to look critically at their own work, self-reflect, and, with the aid of our coach's experience, identify strengths and growth opportunities, set goals and guide them toward realization.

After the initial orientation, participants will meet individually with our expert facilitator via virtual and in-person conferences throughout the process. The cohort will reconvene at the end of the session to reflect as a group on the process. A selfie video tech support meeting is also provided.

The course is 15 total hours.

Unpacking Fountas and Pinnell's Leveled Literacy Intervention Systems

Participants will explore the organization of the LLI systems and how to effectively use the systems to teach 30-45 minute lessons to small groups of learners with similar needs.

The features of Leveled Literacy Intervention include:

- Fast-paced lessons that include explicit instruction in phonemics/phonics, vocabulary, fluency and comprehension
- Daily lesson plans using a prescribed sequence of texts purchasable through Heinemann
- Instructional interactions between teachers and students with a low student teacher ratio
- Emphasis on comprehension of fiction and nonfiction texts with time engaged in reading continuous texts, word study and writing
- Continuum of Literacy Learning to guide the series of lessons
