



Adult Literacy

Adult Literacy Classes

In today's workforce, a High School diploma or a High School Equivalency diploma (HSE) is needed to qualify for many jobs. Literacy classes are available at no cost to individuals 21 years of age or older who are without a high school diploma and want to prepare for the TASC (high school equivalency diploma) exam. Literacy classes focus on essential math, reading and employment skills needed to be successful in the workplace.

Classes are:

- Specifically tailored towards each student's academic level
- Taught by NYS certified teachers
- Free, following \$25 one-time registration fee (waived for individuals with a NYS benefit card)

Additional High School Equivalency Opportunities offered at CWD

Distance Learning

Unable to attend class on a regular basis? Join our distance learning program and prepare for the TASC exam at home. We prepare individualized packets of work and drop them at your nearest library for you to pick up. Up to three hours of in class tutoring each week is included.

Math Fast Track!

Are you struggling to pass the TASC math subtest? Join our Fast Track program! Developed by the New York State Department of Education, Fast Track is comprised of packets which help you practice TASC math topics. Study at home at your own pace, and receive up to six hours of in person tutoring at CWD.

The National External Diploma Program (NEDP)

NEDP is a task-based, Distance Learning program resulting in the award of a High School Diploma. NEDP is designed for adults with work and life experiences. Earn a NYS High School equivalency diploma through computer-based assessments completed at your own pace. NEDP Students are assigned an advisor to guide students through the program.

English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL)

ESOL is a program for individuals with limited English proficiency. It provides instruction in the areas of listening, speaking, reading and writing. Learn the skills necessary to be successful in the workplace, enter job training programs, or continue on to higher education! Day and Evening classes and Distance Learning options are available.



Dental Assistant

Do you enjoy making people smile? Consider a career as a dental assistant. Students will gain knowledge and hands-on experience in all dental specialties, including dental anatomy/ terminology, instrument care/use and chair-side procedures in a real-life dental lab environment with anatomically correct prosthetics and appropriate office equipment.

Electrical - Industrial

This course is designed to introduce you to single and three phase power distribution, basic motor controllers, starters, relays, and wiring standards. It will prepare you to continue in any skill trades programs and give you a basic understanding of



industrial power distribution. Total program hours: 54

Electrical - Intro AC/DC

Introduce yourself to the fundamentals of electricity. Designed for anyone thinking of a career change, job enhancement or just to acquire a better understanding of electricity and electronics. Topics include - electrical components their uses and symbols, electronic circuit



identification and elements, Ohms law, resistor color codes and test equipment. PLUS "hands on" experimentation with basic electrical circuits. **Total program hours: 42**

Electrical-Programmable Logic Controllers (PLC)

This is basic electrician automation and PLC (Programmable Logic Controllers) course that is an excellent refresher for maintenance electricians, as well as equipment maintenance personnel. Topics include: electrical and control hardware, electrical control circuits, and electronic control systems including PLCs, PLC basic programming & diagnostics and troubleshooting. **Total program hours: 16**

Electrical-Residential Wiring

Discover the methods of installing home wiring, circuit layout and design, component installation and code requirements based upon the latest national codes. When completed, you will be able to maintain existing electrical circuits and install basic wiring in existing and new structures. Total program hours: 54



Forklift Training

The forklift certification class includes classroom theory and practical evaluations. The student will review legislation relating to the OSHA (Occupational Health and Safety Act.) The instructor will list specific driving rules for the student to use and follow. The course involves review



and testing both written and practical. The practical portion of the test takes about 15 minutes per student. Upon completion of the program you will be issued a wallet size certificate of completion. Classes are held outside - come dressed for the weather. No lunch provided. No driver license required. **Total program hours: 5.5**

Geometric Dimensioning & Tolerancing (GD&T)

Students will receive lecture, visualization and worksheet instructions in Geometric Dimensioning and Tolerancing. This program will cover such topics as: dimensioning, general tolerancing, symbols and terms, datums, modifiers, geometric characteristics, true position, metrics (units, dual dimensioning, conversion, and accuracy), and applications. The student will finish this class with a greater understanding of how, why and where geometric dimensioning and tolerancing is used. **Total program hours: 24**

Home Remodeling 1: Framing & Drywall

In Home Remodeling 1 you will be receive hands on instruction with tools and materials required to work with wall framing and drywall. You will learn how to frame walls, hang and install new drywall, repair/remove damaged areas and how to finish the new or repaired drywall. Total program hours: 24



Home Remodeling 2: Floors, Windows, Doors

This course expands on the fundamentals of Home Remodeling 1, by teaching you the fundamentals of how to prepare and install ceramic tiling for walls and flooring, hardwood flooring, doors, windows and trim. The appropriate tools and materials will be used, and the importance of site preparation will be covered. You will also learn how to repair or replace hardwood floors using the tongue and groove method. **Total program hours: 21**

Home Remodeling 3: Electrical & Plumbing

You will receive hands on instruction with the tools and materials needed to work with electrical devices. You will learn how to change a wall socket, light switch, install junction boxes, install lights and doorbells, and identify electrical problems that you will be able to repair or when to call an electrician. The plumbing portion of the program introduces the student to plumbing concerns around the home. You will be introduced to the tools and materials required. Students will be introduced to copper pipe and how to work with it, PVC and how to work with it; and how



to unclog blockages and take care of small repairs. We will also cover the installation and repair of toilets and replacing supply lines and valves. Installation and repair of faucets and their supply lines and valves will also be covered. **Total program hours: 18**

Home Remodeling 4: Flipping Houses NEW

Are you interested in flipping houses? In Home Remodeling 4 we will extend the hands-on learning of home renovations focusing on painting, cabinet removal and replacement, countertop installation and other related topics. Additionally, you will hear from experts in the real estate market that will help guide you in areas like financing, legal issues, and property staging. **Total program hours:18**

HVAC-EPA Certification (Section 608) Online

This program is an EPA approved certification program and meets the requirements set forth in SECTION 608 of the Clean Air Act, as regulated by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). We are also an approved test site. This program allows the individual to study at their own pace with materials provided by us.

The information is the same as if you were attending class. The information covers an introduction to Basic Principals of Refrigeration for CORE, Type I, Type II and Type III Certifications. When you are ready to take your test, you will need to contact us. A test date will be set up for you with one of our Proctors. (Fee includes: Book, PowerPoint and Testing Fees.)

HVAC-EPA Certification (Section 608) Prep & Test

This 12-hour, instructor lead course covers all essential material to prepare and successfully complete the EPA certification test to meet the requirements set forth in SECTION 608 of the Clean Air Act, as regulated by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The information covers an introduction to Basic Principals of Refrigeration for CORE, Type I, Type II and Type III Certifications. Three hours will be allowed for testing. (Fee includes: Book, PowerPoint and Testing Fees.) **Total program hours: 24**

HVAC-1: Air Conditioning Systems

In HVAC-1, you will be introduced to Air Conditioning Systems. The course emphasizes the fundamentals of air conditioning, and knowledge of the tools and materials needed to repair the electrical/mechanical portion of the A/C system. Learning Objectives include: Cycle



of refrigeration, Components of refrigeration system, Heat pumps, Thermostats, Heat loss/heat loads, Residential A/C & refrigeration, and Electric meter training. **Total program hours: 36**

HVAC-2: Refrigeration

HVAC-2 deepens your understanding of refrigeration systems and refrigerants. In addition to the learning objective below, you will leave this course with the ability to identify refrigerants according to their series number and cylinder color code. Learning Objectives include: Pressure/



temperature relationship, Superheat/subcooling, Proper refrigerant charge, Latent heat/sensible heat, Refrigerant recovery/charging/evacuation, and System troubleshooting. **Total program hours: 24**

HVAC-3: Heating Systems

Learning Objectives include: Furnace (forced air distribution system), Boiler (Radiator distribution system), Heat Pump, Hybrid Heating, Ductless Mini-Splits, Radiant Heating, Baseboard Heaters and Furnace (forced air distribution system). **Total program hours: 36**

Machining Introduction

A beginning industrial machine shop course introducing students to the basic machines used in industry today and the techniques used in operating them. Introduction to metal cutting machines such as the lathe, vertical mill, handsaw and drill press. Also covered are precision-measuring



tools, layout tools, blueprint reading and machine safety. Hands-on Labs Included: each student will produce their own project piece.

Total program hours: 42

Machining Advanced

This course will cover more in-depth applications of modern and advanced equipment and precision machining processes. Topics include drills and drilling machines; types of cutting fluids; precision grinding; milling machine, introduction to Computer Numerical Control (CNC) machining; metal characteristics, heat treatment & metal finishing; other machining processes (plastics, chipless machining, powder metallurgy and cryogenic applications). Handson Labs Include: adjustments and experimentation of metals; advanced project, such as a vee-block and/or clamp. **Total program hours: 42**

Machining Blueprint Reading

Students will receive lecture, visualization and worksheet instructions in the field of Blueprint Reading Basics.
Topics will include: the manufacturing cycle, drawings, dimensions and notes; reading of blueprints; discussion of the



lines and views; the total blueprint (arrangement, sizes, title block, scale and change block); introduction to the dimension elements; introduction to the type of tolerances and methods of displaying tolerances. The student will have a good understanding of basic machining blueprints. **Total program hours: 42**

Math Module 1

This class is ideal for those students seeking to refresh their foundational math skills prior to exploring programs in the skilled construction trades or advanced manufacturing. This course develops student's foundational success for a number of our Adult Training Programs, by developing



mathematical reasoning skills and problem solving while appropriately applying math to real world situations. The course will provide a review of basic arithmetic functions, integers, fractions, decimals, percents, ratios and proportions, and measurement using metric and standard conversions. Also, basic geometry and trigonometry will be reviewed. Required for Electrical, HVAC, Machining & Welding certificate courses. Total program hours: 3

Math Module 2

Welding Introduction

Follow a series of processes that will take you through Oxyacetylene welding and cutting, equipment setup, shielded metal arc (stick), metal inert gas (MIG), tungsten inert gas (TIG), single and multiple pass welding in all positions. Curriculum follows the guidelines of the American Society of Welding. Auto-darkening hood will be available Student supplies gloves and light welding jacket. **Total program hours: 30**



Welding MIG

Learn to weld sheet metal and thicker types of materials incorporating different joint designs using the gas metal arc welding process. Students will also learn to weld carbon steel material utilizing the Fluxcore Welding process. CWD Program Policies

Job Training Programs

Admissions:

CWD admits, as adult learners, applicants who have completed a program application and passed the entrance assessment. Applicants must submit all required documentation, secure satisfactory payment arrangements and be beyond the compulsory age of attendance as set by New York State.

Code of Conduct:

The Monroe 2-Orleans BOCES is committed to providing a safe, respectful, healthy, civil, orderly and supportive school environment where students may receive, and staff may deliver quality educational services without disruption or interference. Responsible behavior by students, staff, parents, board members, and visitors is essential to achieving this goal.

The Board has a set of expectations for conduct on all BOCES property (whether owned or leased) and at all BOCES functions (wherever the function is located) and/or including at a work-based learning site. These expectations are based on the principles of civility, mutual respect, citizenship, character, tolerance, honesty and integrity.

Refund/Withdrawal Policy:

An adult learner wishing to withdraw should complete and submit a Student Withdrawal Form, which can be obtained from either the Admissions Advisor or the CWD main office.

Full Refund: A written request to withdraw from the course must be received by the CWD office no later than five (5) business days prior to the first scheduled day of class. A \$50 processing fee will be deducted from the full refund amount.

Partial Refund: A written request to withdraw from the course must be received by the CWD office upon withdrawal. A percentage of the program tuition will be refunded depending on the percentage of the program hours completed, less a \$50 processing fee.

- Up to 7% of the program hours completed = 75% refund
- Up to 13% of the program hours completed = 50% refund
- Up to 20% of the program hours completed = 25% refund
- Over 20% of the program hours completed = no refund
- Refunds take approximately 4 6 weeks for processing

Federal Title IV Refunds:

The financial aid (Pell Grant and student loans) earned by the adult learner is equal to the percentage of the period of enrollment completed. When an adult learner withdraws before completing more than 60% of the period of enrollment, the percentage of financial aid is prorated using the Federal Refund/Repayment Policy.

The returned funds must be refunded to the following sources in this specific order:

- 1. Unsubsidized Federal Direct Loans
- 2. Subsidized Federal Direct Loans
- 3. Federal PLUS Loans
- 4. Federal Pell Grant

Outstanding Balances:

Upon termination of enrollment, any balance due to CWD (based on the school's refund policy) is payable immediately. All charges on the student's account must be paid in full prior to the completion of the training program. CWD reserves the right to withhold student transcripts and deny approval for state board examinations to any student who has an outstanding balance with the Financial Aid Office.

Academic Grievance:

We anticipate that each adult learner's educational experience will be a positive and successful one. The CWD Adult Learner Handbook details the procedures to follow when the adult learner believes they have experienced a problem that he/she believes will interfere with their academic success.

------ Continuing Education Programs

- Every effort is made to conduct classes as listed on our webpage or in our catalog. Circumstances may make it necessary for classes to be canceled or postponed, or for instructors and classrooms to be changed.
- All programs must reach a minimum enrollment at least four business days prior to the start of the first scheduled class. If it is necessary to delay the start of a program you will be notified and have the option to enroll at another date, take a similar offering, or request a refund.
- Any individual 17 years of age or older may register for part-time courses. High School students must be at least 17 years of age and have written permission from their Principal or Guidance Counselor.
- Participants are registered on a first come, first served basis, and registration is confirmed upon receipt of payment.
- Registration acknowledgments are emailed. Note the scheduled date of the first class meeting.
- Registration fees do not include books or supplies.
- Certificates of Completion will be issued to students who have maintained at least 80% attendance and have shown successful completion of the skills and aptitudes necessary for course completion as determined by a passing grade from the instructor.

- Credit Cards (VISA/Master Card), Check, Money Order and cash are acceptable forms of payment for registration, books and supplies.
- Corporate Billing is available. Tuition vouchers are accepted.
- Refund/Withdrawals:
 - Full Refund: A written request to withdraw from the course must be received by the CWD office no later than five (5) business days prior to the first scheduled day of class.
 - o **Partial Refund:** A percentage of the program tuition will be refunded depending on the amount of notice received, less a \$50 processing fee.
 - o Notice less than five (5) school days prior to the start of the first scheduled class = 90% refund
 - Notice after the first class and at least twenty-four (24) hours prior to the scheduled date of the second class = 75% refund
 - O Notice after the second class = no refunds
 - o Refunds take approximately 4 6 weeks for processing.
